NON-DISCRIMINATION POLICY STATEMENT - Section 504

The Board of Directors of the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District is responsible for locating and identifying homeless children and youth who are "identified" within the district. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

**The Louisa-Muscatine Community School District maintains records on each student in order to facilitate the instruction, guidance and educational progress of the student. The records contain information about the student and his or her education and may include, but not limited to, the following types of records: identification data, attendance data, record of achievement, family background data, aptitude tests, educational and vocational plan, honors and activities, discipline data, objective counselor or teacher ratings and observations and external agency reports.
**The Records of each student are generally located in the school, which he or she is attending. Any exception will be noted in the students other records

or by the person in charge of record maintenance of student records for each school building listed below:

**The following persons, agencies and organizations may have restricted access to student records without prior written consent of the parent or student over the age of 18 years. Any other access to student records shall be only upon written consent or upon court order or legally issued subpoena. A. School officials, teachers and Mississippi Bend Area Education

- Agency personnel with legitimate educational interests. B. Officials of other schools in which the student proposes to
- enroll.
- C. Representatives of state and local government when auditing and evaluating Federal educational programs.
- D. Officials connected with a students educational financial aid application.
- E. Government officials to whom information is to be reported
- under state law adopted prior to November 19, 1974. F. Organizations that process and evaluate standardized tests.
- G. Accrediting organizations for accrediting purposes.
- H. Parents of dependent children, regardless of child's age
- I. Appropriate parties in a health or safety emergency.


Student Directory Information:

**The Principal or person in charge of each attendance center may release the following types of information to the public, where appropriate, keeping in mind the privacy of the student and the student's family and the totality of the surrounding circumstances: name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, e-mail address, grade level, enrollment status, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous educational agency or institution attended by the student, photograph and other likeness, and other similar information. Examples of releases are: military recruitment, articles published in the newspaper, etc. To prevent the public release of such information, a parent must file a written objection with the aforementioned person responsible for maintaining student records by August 31st. The objections need to be renewed annually. Students and parents may file with the Department of Education, complaints concerning alleged failures of the school district to comply with federal legislation dealing with student records. Correspondence should be addressed to: The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office, Department of Education, Switzer Building, 330 C Street S.W., Washington, D.C. 20201

**If you are the parent or legal guardian of a student you have the right to (1) inspect and review your child's educational records; (2) ask for an explanation of any item in the records; (3) have copies made at a reasonable cost; (4) be informed of types and locations of records being collected or used by the agency; (5) ask for the amendment of any record if you feel it is inaccurate, misleading or violates privacy rights; (6) a records hearing if the agency does are the agency to be added to be added

<u>9th Grade-</u>

Certificate of Dental Screening

12th Grade:

Up to date Vaccine Certificate w/ proof of MCVO4. For the MCVO4(Meningitis vaccine) there must be one dose given after age 16. NO GRACE PERIOD

 \Rightarrow It is the policy of the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District that school employees and volunteers not commit acts of physical or sexual abuse, including inappropriate and intentional sexual behavior, towards students.

 \Rightarrow It is the policy of the district to respond to allegations of abuse by school employees or volunteers by investigating or arranging for the full investigations of any allegations, and to do so in a reasonable prudent manner.

 \Rightarrow Anyone believing that a district employee or volunteer has abused a student may report the abuse to the level one investigators: Aimee Wedeking, Principal-Elementary, 319-726-3634 or Chris Parkhurst, Principal-HS, 319-726-3421. IF YOU LIVE IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

In a shelter

In a motel or campground due to the lack of an alternative adequate accommodation

In a car, park, abandoned building, or bus or train station

Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship

You may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

Eligible students have the right to:

- Receive a free, appropriate public education.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment.
- Enroll in school and attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.

• Enroll in the local school; or continue attending their school of origin (the school they attended when permanently housed or the school in which they were last enrolled), if that is their preference.

* If the school district believes that the school selected is not in his/her best interest, then the district must provide the student with a written explanation of its position and inform the student of his/her right to appeal its decision.

Receive transportation to and from the school of origin, if requested.

• Receive educational services comparable to those provided to other students, according to the students' needs.

Parents'/Guardians' Rights Notification

Parents/Guardians in the Louisa-Muscatine Community School District have the right to learn about the following qualifications of their child's teacher: state licensure requirements for the grade level and content areas taught, the current licensing status of your child's teacher, and baccalaureate/graduate certification/degree. You may also request the qualifications of an instructional paraprofessional who serves your student in a Title I program or if your school operates a school-wide Title I program. Parents/Guardians may request this information from the Office of the Superintendent by calling 319-726-3541,or sending a letter of request to Office of the Superintendent, Louisa-Muscatine CSD, 14478 170th St., Letts, Iowa, 52754. The Louisa-Muscatine Community School District ensures that parents will be notified in writing if their child has been assigned, or has been taught by a teacher for four or more

consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not considered highly qualified.

Free or reduced-cost lunches are available to students. Application forms are available from building offices upon request. No free or reduced-cost meals

will be served until an approved application for the family is on file in the district.
Until approval, the student will purchase full priced lunches.

A LETTER FROM OUR SUPERINTENDENT:



Patrons,

Last year Louisa-Muscatine (L-M) School District surveyed you to determine your approval of bonding for a varsity gym and a new HVAC (heating/cooling) system at the elementary. The estimated cost of this project was around 12 million dollars, with an option to increase the bond to 17 million to include wrestling, AG, weight room, performing arts, and playground additions/upgrades. It is apparent from the survey that the district needs to revisit what we put before the voters. Thank you to those who completed and returned the survey.

L-M will continue to phase in improvements to our buildings and grounds with currently available funds. We are in the final stages of completing a transportation/maintenance building and have repaired the elementary HVAC system using Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) funds. In recent years, the PPEL funds have allowed the district to install new roofs on all buildings, renovate locker rooms, replace classroom flooring, resurface the track, buy buses, and much more. To continue maintenance and renovation at L-M, the Board asked voters to approve the continuation of the \$1.00 PPEL last Fall. That PPEL renewal passed overwhelmingly. Thank you for voting.


The L-M Board of Directors is considering a bond resolution of a lesser amount for an additional secondary school gym. At the earliest, this bond will be on the ballots during the general election on November 5, 2024. We are currently working with architects to establish current costs for this addition. We are hosting a public forum to review possibilities, gain community insight, and answer questions on March 20, 2024, at 7:00 PM in the High School Cafeteria.
